OUR MISSION

Family ACCESS empowers and strengthens families and the community by providing programs that nurture child development, prevent trauma, promote effective parenting skills and support working parents.

For 115 years, our organization has served thousands of families from racially, economically and culturally diverse backgrounds in local communities across Middlesex and Norfolk counties.

Our three integrated programs are based on decades of research in neuroscience and early child development that point to the importance of early formative experiences and the power of engaged parents to raise strong, resilient children.

Our programs and services continue to expand to meet the needs of our community. In FY23, we now provide support and services across 19 communities in five languages.

OUR PROGRAMS & HIGHLIGHTS



EARLY LITERACY SERVICES (ELS)

Provides a variety of evidence-based programs, resources, and referrals to help build literacy-rich homes, support parents in understanding their child's development and offer opportunities to engage with other families in the community. Programs include:

COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS: Empowering parents and children with literacy groups, child development support, and resources in underserved communities.

PARENTCHILD+: Home visits support early literacy and school readiness for underserved families.

RAISING A READER: Engaging children with interactive reading, supporting parents and educators in shared reading routines.

HIGHLIGHT: Served over 6,300 participants with 100% of ELS parents reporting improved understanding of child learning, daily reading habits, and school preparation.



COUNSELING AND CONSULTATION SERVICES (C&CS)

Provides comprehensive clinical services and socialemotional support to parents and their children to address present challenges and mental health concerns.

YOUNG PARENT SUPPORT SERVICES: Home-based support for pregnant women and young parents up to age 23.

ROOTS TO BLOSSOM: Extends support for pregnant and parenting young adults up to age 26.

PARENTING SUPPORT GROUPS: Culturally relevant and evidence-based groups (CIRCLE OF SECURITY, ABRIENDO PUERTAS/OPENING DOORS and SOLO NOSOTRAS) to build strong families.

PARENT CONSULTATION: Short-term counseling for parents of young children facing specific challenges.

HIGHLIGHT: Served 300+ participants with 1,500+ clinical hours (50%+ increase from FY22), leading to 95% of clients showing improved family stability.



EARLY LEARNING CENTER (ELC)

Provides high-quality, play-based early education and family support services to infants, toddlers, preschoolers, and PreK as well, from economically and culturally diverse communities.

HIGHLIGHT: Supported nearly 100 children and their families, a more than 50% increase over FY22, offering high-quality childcare and allowing parents to participate in the workforce. 90% of ELC children showed improved development across social-emotional, motor, cognitive, and language skills.



PROGRAM GROWTH


In 2023, amidst a backdrop of both challenges and successes, Family ACCESS served over 7,600 participants. Despite a slight dip in total participants, some programs, like the Early Learning Center (ELC) and Counseling and Consultation Services (CCS), saw remarkable growth, reflecting the changing needs of our community. This growth underscores our vital role in providing quality early childhood education and parenting support.

However, we also faced strategic decisions. Due to shifting community needs and our largest client, Newton Public Schools, launching a similar internal approach and program, we made the tough call to discontinue the Child Assault Prevention (CAP) program. This decision followed careful consideration and planning to ensure a smooth transition with minimal disruption.


Though the decrease in CAP participants marks a shift, it doesn't diminish the program's significant impact over our 115-year history. Moving forward, we'll draw on the lessons learned from CAP to innovate and better serve our community's evolving needs.


PROGRAM GROWTH

BRIDGING CULTURES

At Family ACCESS, we're dedicated to creating environments where parents can thrive, grow, and build meaningful connections to lead their children towards positive outcomes.

Since 2020, Family ACCESS has proudly offered ABRIENDO PUERTAS/ OPENING DOORS, a culturally responsive parenting program designed for Latino communities. This evidence-based curriculum honors and supports parents as the leaders of their families and their child's first and most influential teacher.

Thanks to Magda DeSouza's initiative, Family ACCESS is the first in the nation to offer the program in Portuguese. This breakthrough allows us to reach diverse families, expanding our impact in the community.

Each program concludes with a special celebration of the remarkable achievements of parents who completed the program.

in our community.



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
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Supporting Learning: Backpack Donations
